The Hotel ML on Route 73 in Mount Laurel announced the completion of the installation of a solar panel project producing 473,000 watts of solar energy. The solar panel project will reduce the property's carbon footprint by more than 335 metric tons of CO₂. In an effort to further reduce carbon pollutants, the project included 4 GE DuraStation car-charging stations. The Hotel ML is the first hotel in the region to support electric cars. Conveniently located less than one mile from the New Jersey Turnpike and I-295, The Hotel ML invites other green initiative enthusiasts to spend the night or grab a meal while charging their automobile. The entire project is equivalent to planting 9,370 trees every year.
